Peter DuBois

Peter is Director of Music/Organist Emeritus at Third Presbyterian Church, Rochester, New York. He served there for thirty-two years before retiring in June 2023. In addition, since 2009, Peter has been host and producer of the nationally syndicated public radio program, "With Heart and Voice," heard on over 125 public radio stations across the United States. From 2000-2014 he also served as Assistant Professor of Sacred Music at the Eastman School of Music, and Director of the Sacred Music Diploma program. Previously, he served as Director of Music/Organist at Christ Church United Methodist in Charleson, WV (1982-1991), and taught organ at West Virginia Wesleyan College and The University of Charleston.

His work with the choir of Third Presbyterian included two tours to the UK to serve as Choir in Residence at Rochester Cathedral in 2001 and at St. Paul's Cathedral, London, in 2005. In addition, they produced two CD recordings, and annual broadcasts of Lessons and Carols for Christmas Eve on public radio stations across the country.

Peter holds degrees from the Eastman School of Music (BM, 1980) and the University of Michigan (MM, 1982), studying with David Craighead and Robert Glasgow, respectively. He also has undertaken additional private study in Paris with Marie-Claire Alain, Marie-Louise Langlais, and Philippe Lefebvre.

Peter's performances have taken him to churches, colleges, and concert halls around the United States and abroad. He has performed internationally at St. Paul's Cathedral, London; the Cathédrale Notre Dame de Paris; the Basilica of St. Clotilde in Paris; and the Cathédrale du Saint-Sauveur in Aix-en-Provence. His performances have been featured many times on the nationally syndicated radio programs, Pipedreams and With Heart and Voice. Peter has performed as soloist with a number of orchestras, including the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra and the West Virginia Symphony Orchestra.
